

# **Nikko AM Concentrated Equity Strategy**

## **Monthly Update 29 February 2024**

Assets are held in the Nikko AM Wholesale Concentrated Equity Fund. The Nikko AM Concentrated Equity Fund (retail) invest in units in the wholesale fund, which the commentary refers to.

#### **Market Overview**

- Global equity markets continued their recent strong run with inflation moving in the right direction, giving comfort that rate increases were at an end.
- The United States S&P 500 index rose 5.2%, the Japanese Nikkei 225 jumped 7.9%, the UK FTSE 100 index was unchanged, the Australian ASX 200 index increased 0.8% and the MSCI World index ended the month up 4.3% (in local terms).
- The S&P/NZX 50 index ended the month down 1.1%.

## **Fund Highlights**

- The fund ended the month up 2.8%.
- It was a busy month with a number of companies reporting earnings for the period ending December and others updating their earnings guidance for the March period.
- The fund's positions in NextDC, Ingenia Communities and Fisher & Paykel Healthcare added value while positions in Spark, Mainfreight and Infratil detracted from value.

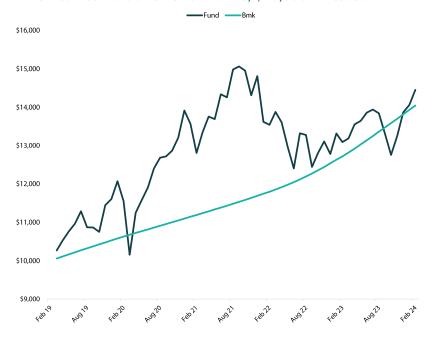
## Overview

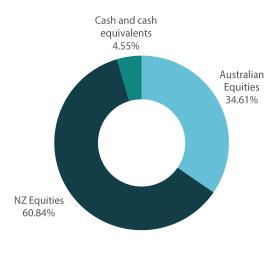
#### Objective

## **Market Commentary**

After a very strong end to 2023 and a solid January, equity markets continued their move higher - assisted by inflation in most economies moving in the right direction giving comfort that interest rate increases were at an end. Despite some economists picking that the Reserve Bank of New Zealand would increase our Official Cash Rate, the RBNZ left the OCR at 5.5% when they released their Monetary Policy Statement late in February. In fact, the RBNZ's statement was more dovish than expected which resulted in bond yields moving modestly lower. Company earnings results were also influential in market returns. New Zealand had quite a divergent set of results and associated stock price moves with a high of +20.8% for Gentrack through to -25.7% for Kathmandu in the S&P/NZX 50 index. Out of the 50 stocks there were 18 positive returns and 32 negative returns.

## **Fund Commentary**

The largest positive contributors were positions in **NextDC** (NXT), **Ingenia Communities** (INA) and **Fisher & Paykel Healthcare** (FPH). NXT jumped 25.9% (in AUD) after announcing a good result but more importantly outlining a strong demand outlook driven by cloud and Artificial Intelligence data storage requirements. INA reported a strong result for the first half of its financial year and ended the month 9.2% (in AUD) higher. FPH rose 3.5% on no specific news.

The largest negative contributors to the fund's return were from positions in **Spark** (SPK), **Mainfreight** (MFT) and **Infratil** (IFT). After performing well in January, SPK pulled back in February and was not helped by index fund selling which saw SPK down 4.6%. After performing strongly over recent months, both IFT and MFT pulled back in February on no specific news. IFT ended the month down 2.4% while MFT fell 5.5%.

Portfolio changes over the month included adding **Ryman Healthcare** to the portfolio while reducing positions in **FPH** and **NXT**. The fund's position in A2 Milk was divested.
